Government Course

Those considering business development in LAC based on B2B or B2C business models

- Companies in the pre-commercialization stage of a product/service are also welcome to apply
- Support can also be provided for companies that already have a partner and want to scale up their business(subject to consultation)

Companies that possess solutions that contribute to JICA's priority issue areas and to increasing the effectiveness of JICA's cooperation projects, and that are considering a B2G business model

- Only for applicable companies in the areas and projects presented by JICA
- The solution must already be established, e.g., a solution that has already been demonstrated and is being sold domestically and internationally.

Content of Support

Phase 1: Polishing of ideas, identification of potential partners (Online interviews)

Phase 2: Discuss business plans with potential partners

(including travel support) * Only for companies that have completed Phase 1

Phase 1: Organize a scheme for collaboration with JICA's cooperation projects and implementation of demonstrations with counterpart governments/government-related organizations

Phase 2: Support for consultations with partner countries (including travel support)

Goal

Discussions on a business plan with the initial partner should be completed

Confirmation of possible collaboration with counterpart government/government-related organizations should be completed

Additional support after the program's conclusion

Consideration on the possibility of additional support by IDB

• IDB Lab will decide whether or not to consider the provision of additional support at the end of Phase 2.

Consideration on the possibility of additional support by JICA


- Determined at the end of the support program
- Note, however, that it will take longer to realize any additional support compared to the Business Course, due to the involvement of the counterpart government



Priority areas for which applications are welcomed

Business Course

IDB Lab's areas of focus (this does not preclude applications pertaining to other areas)



IDB Lab welcomes applications from companies with innovative approaches in each of the focus areas

• Silver economy, EdTech, AgeTech, FinTech, ClimateTech, GenderTech, AgTech, etc.

Government Course

For the Government Course, applications are accepted in the following areas

- (1) Amplifying the effects of individual cooperation projects
- Bolivia: "Project for Capacity Development on Integrated Water Management in Cochabamba" (Technical Cooperation)
- (2) Verification of innovative approaches not tied to individual cooperation projects
- Mexico x Agriculture
- Panama x Agriculture
- Latin America & the Caribbean x Environment
- Dominican Republic x Agriculture

- Brazil x Agriculture
- Bolivia x Agriculture
- Peru x Agriculture / Environment / Transportation, etc.




Application Guidelines for Open Innovation Challenge TSUBASA2023

Organizers	JICA (Japan International Cooperation Agency), IDB Lab
Objective	Identification of Japanese start-ups with innovative ideas, business models, and technologies capable of contributing to the solving of development issues in the Latin America and Caribbean region
Welcomed applications	Solutions to specific development issues/SDGs in Latin America and the Caribbean
Solicitation period	Mid-October to mid-December
Application requirements	 ✓ Limited to start-ups, SMMEs, in-house ventures of large enterprises, etc. registered in Japan ✓ Be in possession of ideas capable of contributing to the solving of development issues / achievement of SDGs in Latin America and the Caribbean ✓ Considering business development in countries supported by JICA/IDB Lab ✓ Must be able to participate in the 6-month long support program
Areas of application	 Business Course: No specific restrictions apply Applications pertaining to innovative solutions are welcomed, especially in priority areas Silver economy, EdTech, AgeTech, FinTech, ClimateTech, GenderTech, AgTech, etc. Government Course: Applications are accepted in the following areas (1) Bolivia: "Project for Capacity Development on Integrated Water Management in Cochabamba" (Technical Cooperation) (2) Mexico x Agriculture, Panama x Agriculture, Latin America & the Caribbean x Environment, Dominican Republic x Agriculture, Brazil x Agriculture, Bolivia x Agriculture, Peru x Agriculture/Environment/Transportation, etc.



Solicitation Process for Applications







Points to Keep in Mind when Applying: About TSUBASA

- ✓ Definition of the welcomed type of innovation: Approaches to achieving SDGs that are innovative
 - Recognizing the innovation of the approach rather than the innovation of the product itself
- ✓ On the selection of the course to apply for: It is possible to apply to both the Business Course and the Government Course at the same time
 - However, the order of preference concerning which course you are selected for should be clarified
- ✓ Selected to go into the idea-polishing category: Cases where significant pivoting of the business idea is required are selected to go into the idea-polishing category
 - If selected for participation in the idea-polishing category, mentoring will take about one month after selection to settle the direction of the use case and business model, after which the participant will proceed to either the Business Course or GovernmentCourse. If no agreement on the direction can be reached, support will be terminated.
 - If pivoting will be difficult, this should be clearly stated in the application form
- ✓ Diversity considerations: In the selection process, consideration is given to the diversity and inclusion aspects of team structures and ideas
- ✓ Assistance with travel expenses: Support will be provided only to companies for which it is deemed appropriate, and a portion of the support amount will be borne by the company.
 - Business Course: The goal is to finalize a collaboration plan with a potential partner identified during the program. Only for companies that have completed Phase 1.
 - Government Course: The goal is to verify the hypothesis for collaboration in consultation with the local government
- **✓ Re-application by previously selected companies: Previously selected companies are allowed to reapply**
 - Contact administrators in advance for conditions.





Points to Keep in Mind when Applying: About Additional Support

- ✓ Positioning of additional support: Consideration will be given only when a business plan is validated during the TSUBASA program
 Whether additional support can be provided is determined by JICA for the Government Course, and by IDB Lab for the Business Course.
- ✓ Additional support by JICA (Government Course): When considering collaboration with an ODA project, please note that a long period of time will be required from the start of discussions with the counterpart government/government-related organization to project formation.
 - Expect a time horizon of about 2 years from the start of discussions with the counterpart government/government-related organization.
 - Also, depending on the tendency of discussions with the counterpart government/government-related organization, there may be changes in policy during the process.
